### Why you teach it - your purpose of study

### What you teach - your programme(s) of study

Our intent is to build a DT curriculum which provides an opportunity for all children to learn the skills required to become a successful designer. We encourage children to discover an interest in design technology, by allowing the children to critically engage with design, sculpture and construction.

We provide a balanced and broad curriculum which promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils. This will prepare them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences in later life. We believe our progressive DT curriculum has planned opportunities to create and evaluate a range of products, giving all learners the opportunity to enjoy being creative. Our curriculum enables learners to access a range of materials to understand their properties, to encourage learners to engage with products, considering their purpose and practicality. It also allows children to widen their vocabulary and use of technical language. To apply the skills acquired within Art and DT lessons to cross-curricular topics, allowing children to use their skills to reflect on and explore topics in greater depth; for example, using DT as a medium to express emotion and thought to enhance their personal, social and emotional development.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

Smallwood's curriculum is clearly sequenced, and a progressive form of study based on the requirements of the National Curriculum. Our children are provided a range of materials for them to explore, giving them an opportunity to develop a range of given skills. Smallwood provides high quality teaching, with regular monitoring and assessment (based on key milestones), that is appropriately pitched to the needs of the individual. As we nurture a resilient learning attitude towards product design, this in turn helps our children to focus on evaluation.
