### Why you teach it - your purpose of study

The national curriculum for reading intends to ensure that all pupils:

- read easily, fluently and with good understanding
- develop the habit of reading widely and often, for both pleasure and information
- acquire a wide vocabulary, an understanding of grammar and knowledge of linguistic conventions for reading, writing and spoken language
- appreciate our rich and varied literary heritage
- use discussion in order to learn; they should be able to elaborate and explain clearly their understanding and ideas
- are competent in the arts of speaking and listening, making formal presentations, demonstrating to others and participating in debate

#### INTENT

At Smallwood every child is a reader.

We aim to provide all of our children with...

- the skills to read accurately and fluently through a rigorous and sequential systematic synthetic phonics programme (EYFS-Y2)
- the confidence and knowledge to decode unfamiliar words with increasing accuracy and speed
- a life-long enjoyment of reading and books
- the ability to read with expression, clarity and confidence
- a deeper level of emotional intelligence and empathy
- a higher level of linguistic knowledge of vocabulary and grammar
- the comprehension skills to read and respond to a wide range of different text types
- a literacy rich environment

...so that they can access our full curriculum offer and SHINE at Smallwood and beyond.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

### To instill a love of reading, in Key Stage Two you will see...

- An outdoor library area
- High quality texts available around school
- Class teachers favourite books
- Regular library visits
- Word millionaires (from Year 2)
- Class competition of words read weekly and total number of quizzes taken
- Shine award for Reader of the week
- School book fair
- Special events such as World Book Day and World Poetry Day
- Book wish list in library (Author or book)
- Christmas book gift
- Inviting reading areas
- Non-term time reading challenges
- ERIC Everybody reads in Class

- High quality class novels
- Recommended reads in classes/ around school
- Parent stay and read events
- High quality vehicle texts linked to half-termly topics, PSHE and science
- Suggested book lists for each topic on 9x9 homework grids to inspire wider reading at home
- Visits to local library booked in across the year
- Quality texts from latest booklist and awards on display around school
- A wide range of books available in our school library to appeal to all children and interests

## To develop fluency, accuracy, confidence and comprehension skills in readers, in Key Stage Two you will see...

- Accelerated reader from Y2 with comprehension quizzes for each book read
- Ready Steady Phonics baseline assessment used to inform individual/ small group interventions
- Regular assessment points (Star Reader half-termly)
- All staff model reading with fluency, accuracy and expression
- Daily reading opportunities across all areas of the curriculum
- Children proof-reading their work regularly for accuracy across the curriculum
- Shared high expectations with parents to support their child on their reading journey (minimum of 4 signatures each week)
- Trained reading volunteers reading 1:1 with identified children
- 1:1 reading sessions with bottom 20% of readers
- Explicit teaching of reading skills (VIPERS) through 4 x weekly shared Reading sessions
- Anchor questions in shared reading lessons focus on individual reading viper/s
- Intervention groups focused on developing reading comprehension
- Opportunities for children to conduct own research/ reading and present/ feedback to the class

#### **IMPACT**

At Smallwood you will see a consistent approach to the teaching of Shared Reading in KS2. Children have a love of reading, read with fluency, accuracy, confidence and understanding and can thus access our broad curriculum offer.
