OUR CLASSROOM








Routine

- Every morning we take the zippy bags, books and diaries in, the children will learn to put them in their place on the table for us to check
- We check the diaries everyday. Please put any useful information in there.
- We have a timetable that we try to stick to as the children feel safe and understand what is happening
- Literacy, maths, phonics in the morning and topic, RE or PE in the afternoon
- All the classes in school use the visual timetables, this helps children
 - know what is happening across the day
- Alternate Wednesdays Willow will have for French, music and Forest School sessions






- We all have our own coat pegs, drawers, diaries and book bags labelled with our name and a picture. These are the same so that your child will know their belongings even without being able to read their name.
- Every day we pick a special person for the day, the child will hand out the milk and water at snack and lead the lines as we move through school. They then pick the card for the following day. So everyone will have a go a number of times over the year.

SNACK TIME

- ❖ We have toast and milk or water at 10.15am. It is a nice social experience with everyone together talking and sharing. Practicing manners is a good life skill
- We have lunch at 12 o'clock and will collect it from Mrs Lloyd and eat it together in the hall

- Phonics will be the sound we have learnt so your child can be the expert and teach you!
- Please support your child and complete the homework it is a great way of giving them 1 to 1 support

Phonics and reading



In phonics we use a high quality scheme across the whole of KS1 to ensure consistency and quality teaching.

We will send home reading books that are uniquely tailored to the level of reading and the sounds your child is currently working on

Our school expectation for reading is a minimum of 4 times weekly. Please use the diary to write down which book your child has read, any words they found tricky and any feedback/questions you may have

Maths

As a school we use White Rose Maths along with other fantastic resources to help your child gain the concept of number, shape and the use of different functions such as adding, subtracting, doubling and halving

We use numberblocks


